

The Comfort of Home Brings Peace of Mind



When Jack Macholl's 1½ year-old son Justin was diagnosed with autism in the late 1980s, it was "shocking and scary," he said. "We had noticed a regression in his language skills and a neurologist made the diagnosis. In those pre-internet days, there wasn't a lot of information about autism—even from the doctors. So, we felt a bit like autism pioneers, out there looking for resources for Justin."

After much research and investigation, they did find assistance for Justin. "Justin's mom and I found a preschool with an early intervention program that included behavioral therapy because his language regression resulted in a lot of tantrums," Jack said. "Then he went into special ed programs during elementary school and middle school."

But by age 15 Justin needed more specialized attention than his current high school program could provide. That's when Jack made the difficult decision to move Justin to a residential high school in Kansas focusing solely on autistic students. "Justin benefitted from the educational services and life skills programs they provided, but it was hard for all of us because we only saw him every other month."

In 2007, before Justin graduated from his school in Kansas, Justin's family began investigating long-term living options and day programs in the Chicago area. "We all wanted Justin to be close to us, so we did a lot of research to find the place that would best fit Justin's needs," Jack noted. "Clearbrook quickly rose to the top of the list." Mary Rooney, Jack's wife and Justin's stepmother, added, "When


Justin arrived back in Chicago, he literally went from O'Hare directly to his CILA at Clearbrook. We wanted his transition to be as seamless as possible."

Now Justin lives with five other residents who are "almost like brothers," Jack said. "Justin is comfortable in his room, attends CAP [Clearbrook Autism Program] during the day and is only a 20-minute ride away so we can visit whenever we want." Mary continued, "When we do bring him over for a visit, he is always ready to go back to Clearbrook. For Justin, Clearbrook is home."

This is exactly what Jack envisioned for his son and why Jack and Mary have supported Clearbrook with gifts in kind, donations and a provision for Clearbrook in their estate plans. "Clearbrook has always done an exceptional job of not only caring for its clients but also making sure they are integrated into community activities through volunteering efforts like the YMCA and Meals on Wheels," Jack said.

"Until you have a family member with a disability, I don't think you can truly appreciate how important a place like Clearbrook is," Mary explained. Jack added, "Clearbrook gives us peace, and the ability to have our careers and make a living. We simply would not be able to do that if we had to stay home 365 days a year to take care of our son."

"We want Clearbrook to be Justin's home forever," Jack continued. "Through our estate gift, we hope to ensure Clearbrook can continue their work for many, many years to come. It's our way of repaying them for the wonderful care they have given Justin and the comfort and peace of mind they have provided our entire family."

Weichai America, located in Rolling Meadows, is leveraging the trend for clean energy by building natural gas engines for their customers in the oil, gas and irrigation industries. They are also utilizing the energy of Clearbrook clients to keep their United States headquarters on Golf Road clean and tidy –both inside and out.

The partnership between Weichai America and Clearbrook began early in 2014 at a luncheon in Rolling Meadows where Laura Warren, Director of Marketing for Clearbrook, met the Weichai America leadership team. Houman Kashanipour, President, and Brian Stankus, Facility Manager, discussed staffing needs for their new facility.

“Brian talked about the need for janitorial and landscaping help - I proposed Clearbrook clients as the solution and set up a meeting” said Warren. They began with 2 clients and have brought on additional clients working 3 days per week alongside Clearbrook job coaches.

“The quality of the work is very good and we love the interaction with the clients” said Stankus. Kashanipour added “It was the right business decision, the right community

decision and the right decision for a positive impact on our corporate culture.”

Having a positive impact on the environment is important to Weichai America, the first Chinese corporation in the field to gain EPA product certification for their 6.7 litre engine. They are working on 4 additional engines to be launched in the 2017-2018 timeframe. The engines are finished at the Rolling Meadows facility where they also provide parts and service, testing, application engineering and education and training. The engines are sold throughout the United States and Canada.

Victor Liu is the CEO of Weichai America and says he appreciates ‘Team Clearbrook’ every time he sees the clients happily completing their work throughout the the 100,000+ square foot building. “Team Clearbrook is Team Weichai” Liu says with an enthusiastic thumbs up!
