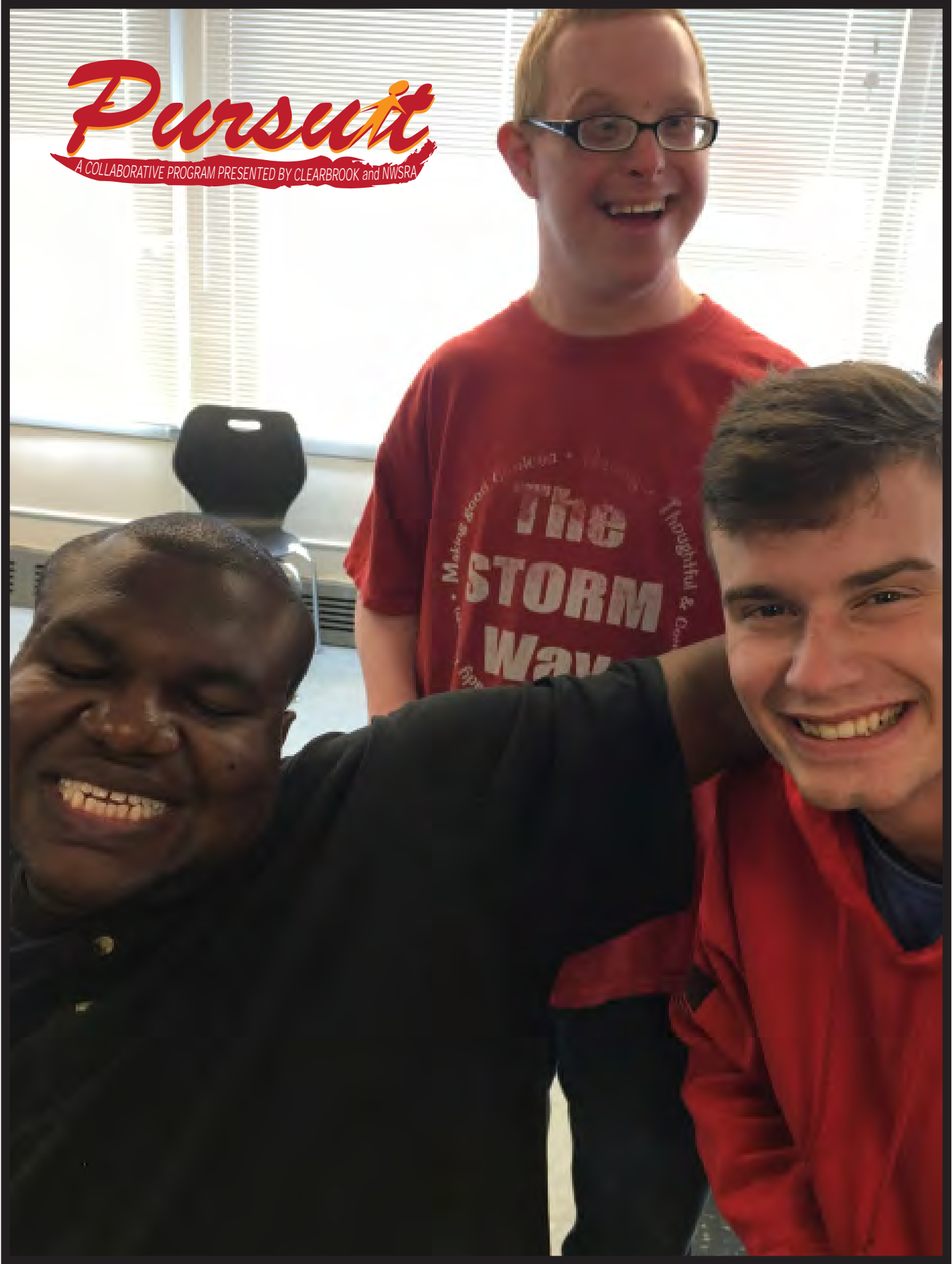

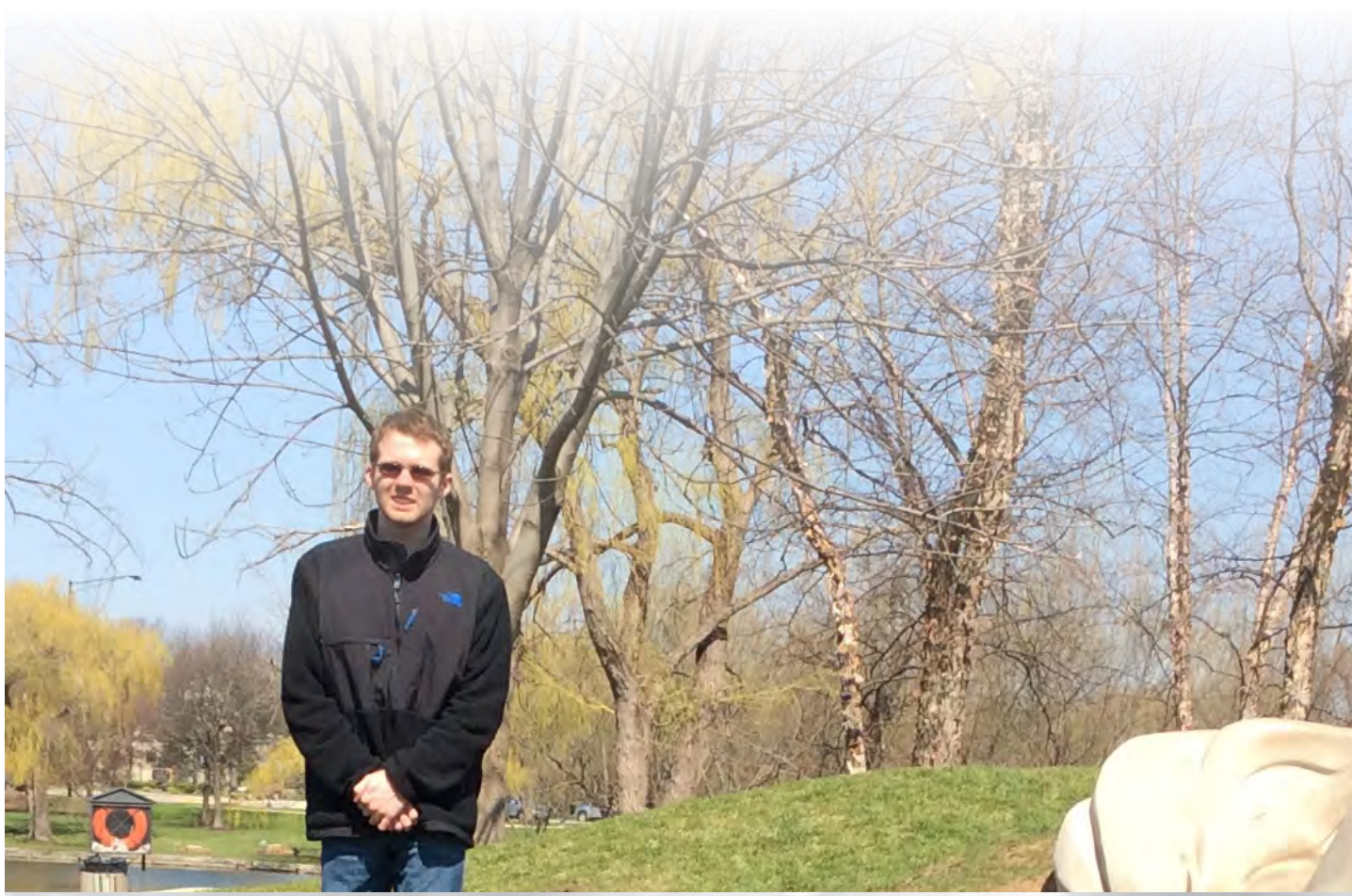

Mission Statement

To provide opportunities for continued growth for adults with disabilities through recreation and leisure activities that are fulfilling and enriching.

Vision Statement

To be a leading force providing adult day programming options to enrich the life experiences of the adult participants and their families in the communities we serve.



Clearbrook serves people over a range of ages and disabilities from children diagnosed with developmental delays at birth to the unique needs of seniors with disabilities and all ages in between.

Annually, Clearbrook supports over 8,000 individuals as well as their families in 15 counties, in over 160 communities and 50 locations throughout Chicago, the suburbs, and northern Illinois. Clearbrook is proud to be the largest provider of home-based services in Illinois.

Mission Statement: Clearbrook is committed to being a leader in creating innovative opportunities, services and supports to people with disabilities.



Northwest Special Recreation Association (NWSRA) was formed in 1974 to provide recreation services to individuals with disabilities and is an extension of 17 member park districts located in the northwest suburbs of Chicago. NWSRA offers public access and year round recreational programming to over 14,000 individuals with disabilities. NWSRA is a two-time National Recreation and Park Association National Gold Medal Award winner and is recognized as a Distinguished Accredited Agency by the Illinois Park and Recreation Association, an honor only 10% of Illinois park and recreation agencies have received.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION



PURSUIT is designed to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities 21 years and older throughout the year by creating recreation and leisure opportunities, improving health and wellness, teaching life skills, self advocacy, and community integration. PURSUIT is licensed by the Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Developmental Disabilities.

Program Time:

Programming is from 9:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.
Monday through Friday

Admission:

Continuous throughout the year, upon vacancies available.

Eligibility:

Participants must be at least 21 years old, have a disability, be able to function in a 1:4 ratio, and do not need assistance administering medications during program time.

PURSUIT IS STRUCTURED AROUND FOUR CORE ELEMENTS

• **Recreation & Leisure**

- Developing gross and fine motor skills
- Experiencing cultural arts (dance, drama, arts and music)
- Participating in passive and active sporting activities
- Learning outdoor awareness

• **Skills & Self Advocacy**

- Expanding communication skills
- Promoting human rights and self advocacy
- Enhancing socialization skills
- Developing technology skills

• **Community Integration**

- Participating in local service projects
- Experiencing group outings and activities
- Exploring community resources
- Gaining vocational skills through volunteer experiences

• **Health & Wellness**

- Setting and maintaining fitness goals
- Encouraging healthy eating habits
- Developing a positive body image
- Learning to cook nutritious snacks and meals
- Promoting a balanced lifestyle
