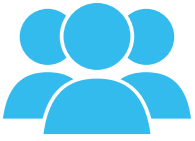

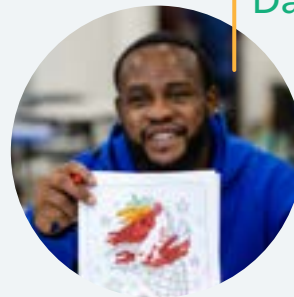

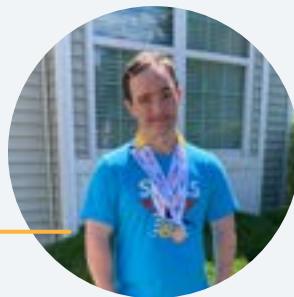

CLINICAL SERVICES

www.clearbrook.org/clinical

- Clearbrook provides a full complement of therapeutic and professional support to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities including behavioral programming, counseling, medical, psychological, and psychiatric consultations.
- We served 138 individuals through therapy services - the Community Mental Health Center, occupational therapy, speech therapy, and physical therapy) - from July 2023 to June 2024.
- We served 312 clients through behavioral services throughout the year.

ABILITY CENTER

The Ability Center focuses on occupational, physical and speech therapy from licensed practitioners and assistants to aid in the treatment of our clients. A variety of tools are utilized, including stairs, mirrors, ramps, and stationary bicycles.

Having a designated space for this allows our staff to see more individuals throughout the day. Through the therapies offered here, individuals improve their quality of life via an array of exercises and real-life application.

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER

Clearbrook has three Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) locations - Crystal Lake, Rolling Meadows and Libertyville - which provide mental health support to adults with mental illnesses.

The CMHC is designed to support the larger community while also providing additional support to the current individuals Clearbrook serves. The focus of the CMHC is individual, group, and family therapy.



CHILDREN'S SERVICES

- Supporting children with developmental delays and their families via direct service, outreach, Family and Community Autism Resource Services, the Child and Family Connections program, and the CHILD Therapy Program.
- Our CHILD Therapy Program served over 482 children from July 2023 to June 2024.
- The Child and Family Connections (CFC) program provides innovative service delivery for families and children by highly qualified professionals in an enriching natural environment. We are now serving an average of 2,554 families each month. We served a total of 5,600 children throughout the year.

CFC

As one of only 25 “front doors” statewide to the Early Intervention System, Clearbrook’s Child and Family Connections (CFC) program provides intake, assessment, evaluation, and service coordination to families of children ages birth to three years throughout North and Northwest suburban Cook Counties.

HOME-BASED SERVICES

Designed to support children in their natural environments, home-based services focus on goal setting and developing new skills to help them move toward independence.

CHILD THERAPY

CHILD (Clearbrook Helps Infants Learn and Develop) Therapy Services offers a family-focused, interdisciplinary approach to assisting families with young children with developmental delays, ages birth to five years .

RESPITE

Clearbrook provides respite services to give families of children (ages 3+) with intellectual and developmental disabilities a much-needed break. They can use the time to run errands, go to the grocery store, or simply as a small moment of rest.



ADULT SERVICES

- Supporting adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities through community day services, community employment, home-based services, and residential programs across Northern Illinois.
- We welcomed 38 individuals into our residential programs from July 2023 to June 2024. This includes Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF) and Community Integrated Living Arrangements (CILA) homes.
- An additional 364 adults joined our Home-Based Services program, ending the year with 1,720 total served in the program. Clearbrook is the largest provider of this service in the state of Illinois.
- We are continuing to expand to new locations in McHenry County (as part of Clearbrook West) and Lake County, allowing us to serve more individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT

Clearbrook’s Community Employment Services (CES) provides individuals with the opportunity to develop crucial skills and professionalism that can be applied in workplace settings. Job coaches evaluate habits and the individual’s readiness to join the workforce, in a variety of fields. Options include employment skills training, supported employment, and independent employment.

HOME-BASED SERVICES

Designed to support adults in their natural environments, Home-Based Services focus on goal setting and developing new skills to help them move toward independence.

RESIDENTIAL

Clearbrook offers residential services in 27 suburbs. Services range from one-person homes to an 80+ resident facility with round-the-clock nursing care. Services and supports are matched to the residents based upon their choices and individual needs.

RESPITE

Clearbrook provides respite services to give families of adults with disabilities a much-needed break. They can use the time to run errands, go to the grocery store, or simply as a small moment of relief.

DAY SERVICES

Clearbrook's Community Day Services help participants acquire new skills and refine existing ones in the areas of daily living, communication, decision-making, and socialization while emphasizing independence.

COMMUNITY DAY PROGRAMS

Techny, Riley, Getz, and ACES are recreational based community day programs for adults with developmental disabilities. The program schedules are primarily activity based, where different activities are run in the program building.

CHOICE PROGRAMS

The primary goal of the CHOICE program is centered around community integration for participants. CHOICE Woodstock focuses primarily on activities, such as, vocational skills, volunteerism and daily living skills. CHOICE McHenry participants take part in social groups, learning experiences, community outings, and more.

PURSUIT

This day service option is a collaboration with Northwest Suburban Recreation Association (NWSRA). PURSUIT provides opportunities for continued growth for adults with disabilities through recreation and leisure activities. This program is located in local park district buildings throughout the suburbs.

1815 CES DAY PROGRAM

This program is tailored for Clearbrook clients who participate in Community Employment Services (CES). The program focuses on being involved in the community and employability skills. The 1815 Day Program is home to Clearbrook's first Vocational Simulation Lab.

NATURALLY GIFTED

Naturally Gifted is designed to offer vocational enrichment and hands-on skills training. The goal of the curriculum is to help participants be successful in work settings and strengthen employment-related skills. To learn more and shop online, visit naturally-gifted.square.site.

PARTNERS IN ADULT LEARNING (PAL)

An innovative partnership between families and service providers, the PAL program presents an array of experiences to adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities and significant physical challenges in the areas of continued learning and community involvement.

Clearbrook is taking a strategic approach to downsizing the Getz program into three smaller, separate structures to create a supportive and inclusive environment for people with disabilities.

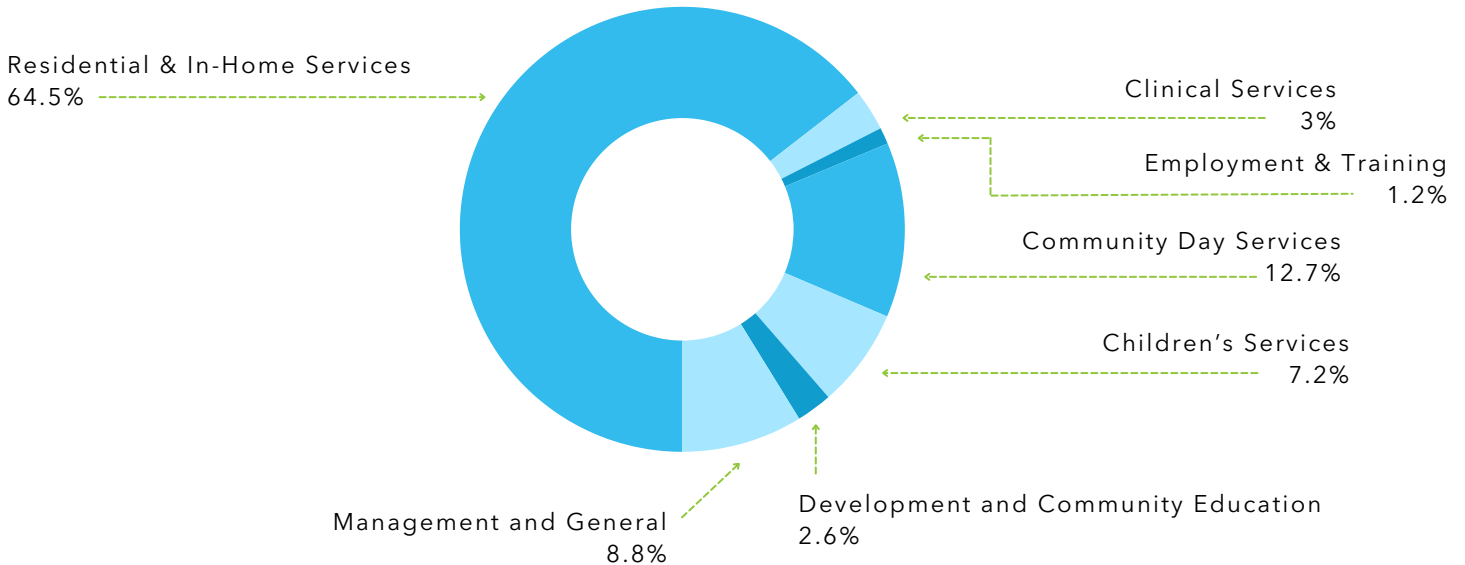

According to the standard recommended by the American Institute of Philanthropy, at least 60% of total expenses should be spent on programs and no more than 40% on administration and fundraising. Clearbrook greatly exceeds this recommendation with **88% of every donation going directly to our programs and services.**

2024 COMBINED STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL POSITION

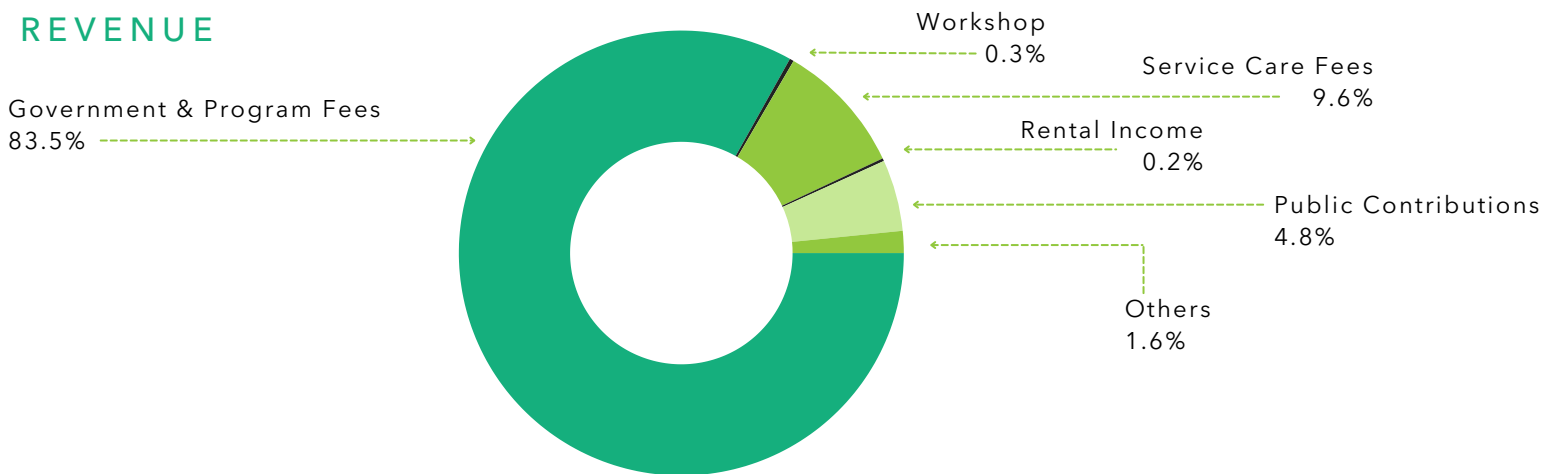
